



Pastoral Ministry Programs Admission Matrix



The following matrix presents the standards and expectations for students admitted to the Pastoral Ministry programs. These programs develop essential competencies for effective pastoral ministry while revitalizing the local church as a disciple making church. The applicant must be active in ministry and authorized to implement assignments within a local church. Involvement in ministry typically is reflected by the following roles: Senior Pastor, Associate/Assistant Pastor, Church Planter, Elder/Church Leader, and Pastor's Spouse. Use the application, prior degree transcripts, certificates, and three reference forms to assess the applicant's qualifications for admission into the appropriate program. *Use the Recognition of Prior Learning Policy only in exceptional circumstances.

Age of Applicant	Teleo University provides distance education for non-traditional students. Typically an applicant is at least 25 years of age, but most are 30-55 years old. Teleo encourages applicants 18-24 to attend a local Bible college. Applicants of this age require additional justification and recommendation by the T-Net country director.
